The story of early Monroe County schools is portrayed for visitors through artifacts and guided tours in this one room schoolhouse.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue approximately 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South towards Interstate 80. Continue for 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Continue on Interstate 80 West for 3 miles. Take Exit 306. Turn left onto Dreher Avenue. Continue approximately 0.6 miles. Turn left onto Glenbrook Road. Continue on Glenbrook Road for 2.5 miles. Turn right onto Cherry Valley Road. Continue on Cherry Valley Road approximately 1.5 miles. End at Bell School. From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue approximately 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South towards Interstate 80. Continue 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Continue 2 miles. Take Exit 307 for Route 191. Turn right onto Route 191 North/Broad Street. Go one block. Turn left onto Ann Street. End at Driebe Freight Station. Grey Towers, the home of Gifford Pinchot, America's first Chief Forester, Conservationist and Pennsylvania Governor, is a National Historic Site on nearly 100 acres. In 1963, John F. Kennedy dedicated the Pinchot Institute for Conservation Studies as a historic landmark.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn left onto Route 209 North. Continue approximately 22 miles into Milford. Stay straight through traffic light. Just past Grand Union Supermarket, bear left onto Oswego Turnpike behind Apple Valley Restaurant. End at Grey Towers.

Harry Packer Mansion - Packer Hill Road, Jim Thorpe, PA 18229 - Phone: 570-325-8566

Built in 1876, as a wedding gift from his father Asa Packer. The mansion is the epitome of Victorian architecture and design.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South. Continue 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Continue 4 miles. Take Exit 304 for Route 33 South/Sciota. Continue approximately 6.5 miles. Take exit for Route 209 South toward Lehigh. Continue approximately 30 miles. In Town of Jim Thorpe, Turn right onto Hazard Square. Immediately Bear right onto Packer Hill Road. Mansion will be on your left.

Asa Packer built these 16 row houses for engineers and foremen of the Lehigh Valley Railroad. The three story row houses were individualized by variations in dormer, bay window, and door and window trim.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South. Continue 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Continue 4 miles. Take Exit 304 for Route 33 South/Snydersville. Continue approximately 6.5 miles. Take exit for Route 209 South toward Lehighton. Continue approximately 30 miles. Turn left onto Quarry Street. Turn left onto Race Street. End at Historic Stone Row.

The Turn family lived on this site from the early 19th century until 1945. Only three structures from this former dairy farm built in the early 19th century remain, a limekiln across the road, a smokehouse, and the remains of the weave house.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Proceed to second traffic light. Turn left onto River Road. Continue for approximately 2 miles. Arrive at John Turn Farm.

Co-founder Josiah White, Lehigh Canal Navigation turned anthracite deposits into profits.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South. Continue for 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Continue 4 miles. Take Exit 304 for Route 33 South/Snydersville. Continue approximately 6.5 miles. Take exit for Route 209 South toward Lehighton. Continue approximately 30 miles. Turn left onto Broadway. End at Lehigh Coal & Navigation.

The Museum is housed in the former St. Paul's Methodist Church building in the Jim Thorpe Historic District. Constructed in 1843 of red brick with high ornate ceiling, the church is a magnificent example of Victorian ecclesiastical architecture. The museum contains working Switchback Railroad and canal lock models as well as museum of the history of Mauch Chunk and a display of Jim Thorpe.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South. Continue for 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Continue 4 miles. Take Exit 304 for Route 33 South/Snydersville. Continue approximately 6.5 miles. Take exit for Route 209 South toward Lehighton. Continue approximately 30 miles. Turn left onto Broadway. End at Mauch Chunk Museum & Cultural Center.

The Museum located in the former John van Campen Colbaugh Homestead and is the only museum in Northeastern PA dedicated to the history of the Delaware Indian, and has exhibits depicting the history of American man in Northeast Pennsylvania from 10,500 BC to the present.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue for 1 mile. Museum is on right.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue

6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South towards Interstate 80. Continue for 4 miles. Merge onto Route 80 West. Continue for 4 miles. Take Exit 304. Make right on Schafers Schoolhouse Road. Go to stop sign. Make left onto Business Route 209 South. Go 1 mile. Make left on Hickory Valley Road. Turn right onto Turkey Hill Road. End at Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm.

Open year-round, the site offers endless opportunities to enjoy a nostalgic journey through railroading's colorful past. A fully operating roundhouse, turntable and locomotive restoration shop, technology and history museums, a full-service visitor's center and a state-of-the-art 250 seat theater complex serve as the perfect back-drop for daily visits and seasonal special events.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn right onto Route 209 South. Continue 6 miles to seventh traffic light. Turn left onto Route 209 South towards Interstate 80. Continue for 4 miles. Merge onto Interstate 80 West. Proceed 16 miles. Take Exit 293 for Interstate 380 North. Continue on Route 380 North for 28 miles to Scranton. Take Left Exit for Interstate 81 South towards Wilkes-Barre. Stay on Interstate 81 South for 3 miles. Take Exit 185 for Central Scranton Expressway. Continue for 1 mile to traffic light. Turn left at light onto Lackawanna Avenue. Turn left onto South Washington Avenue. Steamtown is located directly behind the Steamtown Mall.

The Stourbridge Lion was the first locomotive to run on steam power on rails in America. The train ran from Honesdale to Seelyville on August 8, 1829. From Honesdale to Hawley or Lackawaxen, enjoy a relaxing train excursion through breathtaking scenery.

From Fernwood North Parking Lot. Turn left onto Route 209 North. At blinking light, Turn left onto Bushkill Falls Road. Continue 12 miles to end. Turn right onto Route 402 North. Continue on Route 402 North for 15 miles to end. Turn left onto Route 6 West. Continue on Route 6 West approximately 18 miles into the Town of Honesdale. Proceed straight onto Route 191 South and continue to follow Route 191 South. Turn right onto Terrace Street. Turn right onto Commercial Street. End at Stourbridge Line Excursions.
